

Vendor Quick Guide

UK-based vendors should note the following requirements for transporting animals to Ireland for the purpose of selling at Tattersalls Ireland:

- Valid Identification document (passport) with corresponding microchip number
- Export Health Certificate
- Negative EIA Result (Coggins Test)
- Import Document provided by Tattersalls Ireland mdaly@tattersalls.ie
- GB-based vendors who are sending horses for sale at Tattersalls Ireland will be required to submit an export declaration in GB – provided by your shipping agent.
- CHED-A provided by your shipping agent.
- Import Declaration (SAD) provided by Tattersalls Irelands appointed customs clearance agent, River International.
- VAT/Custom Charges – handled by Tattersalls Ireland under postponed VAT accounting pending sale outcome.
- Tattersalls Ireland are utilising customs procedures to efficiently manage customs duties, but liability remains with the GB-based vendor where customs duties do apply.

In the event of an unsold Lot, kindly note the following requirements to return to the UK:

- Valid Identification document (passport) with corresponding microchip number
- Export Health Certificate
- Import Declaration to APHA provided by your shipping agent.
- Export Declaration to Port of Exit provided by your shipping agent.
- Commercial Invoice provided by Tattersalls Ireland accounts@tattersalls.ie
- Evidence of re-export out of Ireland is provided to Tattersalls Ireland by your shipping agent to avoid VAT due on import being charged to the vendor's account.

Vendors are advised to contact their Shipping Agent as soon as possible following completion of the Sale Entry Form and confirm expected travel details with the Tattersalls Ireland's Bloodstock Department as soon as possible to allow sufficient time to draw up the necessary Customs Documentation.
